*Dr. Daniel H. Gordis is Senior Vice President and Senior Fellow of the Shalem Center in Jerusalem.*

*Prior to his family's making aliyah in 1999, Dr. Gordis served as Vice President for Public Affairs and Community Outreach at the University of Judaism in Los Angeles and was the founding Dean of the Ziegler Rabbinical School. Dr. Gordis received his B.A. from Columbia College, a Masters Degree and Ordination from the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, and his Ph.D. from the University of Southern California.*

*A prolific author, Dr. Gordis has published numerous books and articles on issues related to the future of Jewish life in America, as well as Jewish law and ethics. His most recent book, entitled *Coming Together, Coming Apart: A Memoir of Heartbreak and Promise in Israel*, is a description of the changes in Israeli life from the depths of the Intifada to the end of the Disengagement, and was published by Wiley in 2006.*

*Dr. Gordis resides with his wife, Elisheva, and their daughter and two sons in Jerusalem.*
